

**NCAA Division II Committee on Student-Athlete Reinstatement
Prescribed Penalties**

Agent Violations

(This act is a violation for individuals prior to and after enrollment.)

Description of Violation	Guidelines
1. Prospective student-athlete or transfer from a non-NCAA institution signs an agreement with an agent or an agreement indicating that an individual will represent him or her.	Eligibility not reinstated.
2. Prospective student-athlete or transfer from a non-NCAA institution accepts benefit(s) from an agent valued at \$100 or less.	Eligibility reinstated based on repayment of value of impermissible benefit(s) and 10-percent withholding condition.
3. Prospective student-athlete or transfer from a non-NCAA institution accepts benefit(s) from an agent valued greater than \$100.	Case-by-case review by student-athlete reinstatement staff (minimum condition of repayment and 10-percent withholding condition).

Involvement with Professional Teams

(These acts are only violations subsequent to initial-collegiate enrollment.)

Description of Violation	Guidelines
1. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA member institution, student-athlete signs an agreement to participate in professional athletics (e.g., signs an agreement allows play on professional team, checks professional box on tennis entrance form).	Eligibility reinstated based on being withheld from 10-percent of the institution's season.
2. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA institution, student-athlete competes on a professional team while enrolled in the non-NCAA institution. The student-athlete must have been continuously enrolled at the collegiate institution and not have competed on a professional team while not enrolled. (Intent here is to identify cases where student-athlete attempted to avoid application of organized competition rule with collegiate enrollment).	Eligibility reinstated based on being withheld one contest for every contest competed at the professional level.
3. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA member institution, student-athlete competes on a professional team. Student-athlete enrolled at the collegiate institution and was not continuously enrolled, competition occurred while not enrolled, etc.	Case-by-case review by student-athlete reinstatement staff.
4. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA member institution, student-athlete accepted impermissible actual and necessary expenses.	Eligibility reinstated based on repayment.
5. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA member institution, student-athlete accepts money above actual and necessary expenses, excluding prize money (e.g., salary).	Sit a year and require repayment.

Prize Money

(These acts are only violations subsequent to initial-collegiate enrollment)

Description of Violation	Guidelines
1. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA member institution or a DIII institution, student-athlete accepts prize money. The prize money is accepted during a time when the student-athlete is enrolled full time at a collegiate institution and student-athlete does not have a period where he or she was not enrolled in college after triggering initial-collegiate enrollment.	Eligibility reinstated based on repayment.
2. Following initial full-time enrollment at a non-NCAA member institution, the student-athlete accepts prize money. Prize money is accepted while student-athlete is not enrolled full time or student-athlete has a period of time after enrolling full time where he or she was not enrolled. (Intent here is to identify cases where student-athlete attempted to avoid application of organized competition rule with collegiate enrollment).	Case-by-case review by student-athlete reinstatement staff.
